


2021-2022 Confirmation Expectations and Covenant

This chart gives us a sense of how kids spend their time. Clearly, the most influential people in their lives are NOT the Pastor, Sunday School Teachers, or Confirmation Huddle Guides -- it's parents and other adults who have direct contact with them every day. This is why every single one of us is called to live out our faith all the time, not just at church on Sunday.



One simple way of thinking about this can be summed up in the phrase, "Faithful Living, Changing Lives". We are called to FAITHUL LIVING -- not perfect living or flawless living, but Faithful Living. It means we live our best lives, sometimes succeeding, sometimes failing, but always faithful, and always forgiving. And as we live this faithful, forgiving life, we are a part of CHANGING LIVES. We discover that God wants only the best for us, and in response we want only the best for each other. And that's what Confirmation is all about -- practicing the Christian Life which grounds us in the presence of God for FAITHFUL LIVING and CHANGING LIVES.

As we practice living our faithful life together, our hope would be a commitment to the following:

- 1. Regular attendance at worship, either on-site or online
- 2. Weekly attendance at confirmation classes
- 3. Participation in service projects as assigned
- 4. Completion of 20 "Worship Notes" over the course of the year
- 5. Participating in our "Mentor Project" during Advent and Lent
