Reading Exodus 3

Moses was keeping the flock of his father-in-law Jethro out in the wilderness when the angel of the Lord appeared to him in a flame of fire out of a bush. He looked, and the bush was blazing, yet it was not consumed. God called to him out of the bush, "Moses, Moses!" And he said, "Here I am." Then the Lord said, "I have seen the misery of my people who are in Egypt and I have come down to deliver them from the Egyptians, and to bring them up out of that land to a land flowing with milk and honey. So come, I will send you to Pharaoh to bring my people out of Egypt." But Moses said to God, "If I come to the Israelites and say to them, 'The God of your ancestors has sent me to you,' and they ask me, 'What is his name?' what shall I say to them?" God said to Moses, "I AM WHO I AM." He said further, "Thus you shall say to the Israelites, 'I AM has sent me to you."" But Moses said, "O my Lord, I am slow of speech and slow of tongue." Then the Lord said to him, "Who gives speech to mortals? Is it not I, the Lord? Now go, and I will be with your mouth and teach you what you are to speak." But he said, "O my Lord, please send someone else." Then the anger of the Lord was kindled against Moses and he said, "What of your brother Aaron, the Levite? I know that he can speak fluently. You shall speak to him and I will teach you what you shall say and do. He indeed shall speak for you to the people. Now take in your hand this staff, with which you shall perform many signs."
